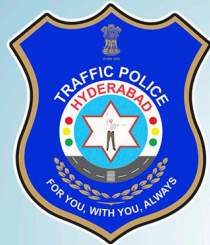

FROM COMMISSIONER'S DESK

As we reflect on the outgoing year, I commend the dedication and hard work of all police personnel in Hyderabad Police Commissionerate, who have been toiling tirelessly 24/7 for public safety and security.

This is a significant year for Hyderabad City Police since nearly after 3 decades, Hyderabad city police commissionerate has been substantially reorganised. Now it is restructured into 7 zones, 28 divisions, 71 L&O Police Stations, 31 Traffic Police Stations and Specialised units like Women Safety Wing, IT Cell, Cyber Crimes etc., that are playing pivotal role in combating new age crimes and other social vices thereby, contributing to citizens' welfare.

Several new buildings for various Police Stations and DCP Offices were inaugurated this year. This transformation strengthened us to control crime, manage traffic, and maintain Law & Order more effectively in this diverse metropolitan city for the years to come.

On the awareness front, Hyderabad City Police in association with Hyderabad City Security Council (HCSC), organised two flagship summits Hyderabad Annual Cyber Security Knowledge (HACK) and She Triumphs Through Respect, Equality and Empowerment (STREE). The sharply targeted investigation work led to the arrest of several perpetrators of crime.

Meticulous Planning, deployment and logistic arrangements, synchronised and synergised team work resulted in smooth conclusion of major festivals and processions. I am delighted to see the communal harmony in the city during every occasion.

Complying with the Election Commission of India norms, all our teams enforced Model Code of Conduct (MCC) during Telangana State Legislative Assembly (TSLA) Elections-2023 and took several measures which facilitated free and fair elections, which is the hall mark of any vibrant democracy.

Here, I want to emphasise that Hyderabad city police would be friendly to law abiding citizens, tough with the law breakers and stern with criminals, however big they might be.

Year on year, Hyderabad City Police contemplates to render police services more effectively. Women Safety always remains our top priority. **Enforcement against drug abuse and illicit trafficking will be intensified.** Lastly, I urge the citizens to promote communal harmony and extend fullest co-operation to the Hyderabad city police.

Kothakota Sreenivasa Reddy, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad City has an illustrious career with a diverse range of postings, showcasing his expertise and commitment to public service. His positions include his role as the Superintendent of Police in Mahabubnagar, where he successfully curbed Naxalism and recovered deadly rocket launchers, leading to the closure of the Maoist Armor unit nation wide.

HE IS THE WINNER OF THE INDIAN POLICE MEDAL FOR MERITORIOUS SERVICE IN 2010, THE PRESIDENT POLICE MEDAL FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICES IN 2019, AND THE ATI-UTKRISHT SEVA PADAK IN 2023.

Throughout his career, he has held key positions such as SP, Nellore, Warnagal and Mahabubnagar DCP, Traffic Hyderabad; Joint Director, Anti-Corruption Bureau; Inspector General of Police for Coastal Security in Vizag and Inspector General of Police/Addl. DGP Operations (Greyhounds & OCTOPUS). His accomplishments include exposing inter-state criminal gangs, unravelling liquor scam and establishing a robust Coastal Security System in combined state of Andhra Pradesh.

In addition to his operational roles, Kothakota Sreenivasa Reddy, IPS has contributed significantly to training and legal aspects. He played a pivotal role in establishing strong training infrastructure in the newly formed state of Telangana and trained over 12,000 police personnel. His efforts led to the recognition of the OCTOPUS Training Center as the best in the country in 2021, earning the Union Home Minister's Trophy.

Adding to his accolades, Kothakota Sreenivasa Reddy, IPS has been bestowed with prestigious medals, including the Indian Police Medal for Meritorious Service in 2010, the President Police Medal for Distinguished Services in 2019, and the Ati-Utkrisht Seva Padak in 2023. Furthermore, his dedication towards public interest was evident in winning a long-pending Supreme Court case related to Greyhounds land in 2023.

- In view of sensitivity of the festival and also in view of prevailing Law & Order situation and security scenario, elaborate and extensive Security and Bandobust arrangements were made for maintenance of public order and to prevent any untoward incidents during the Milad-Un-Nabi celebrations. The celebrations went peacefully without any single incident.

EXERCISING THE POWERS OF THE EXECUTIVE MAGISTRATE

Section 107 Cr.P.C proves to be a crucial instrument in averting potential breaches of peace or disruptions of public tranquility, especially concerning religious events, festivals, elections, and group conflicts. In this context the Hyderabad Police Commissioner, **Sri Kothakota Sreenivasa Reddy, IPS** as Additional Executive Magistrate invoked Section 107 Cr.P.C to address ongoing conflicts, such as a rivalry between rowdy gangs in the Kalapathar Police Station area and a gang rivalry in the Banjara Hills Police Station area.

During the proceedings, the Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad emphasized the significance of Section 107 Cr.P.C as a tool to curb unruly elements and ensure peace in the city.

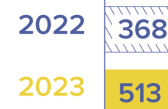

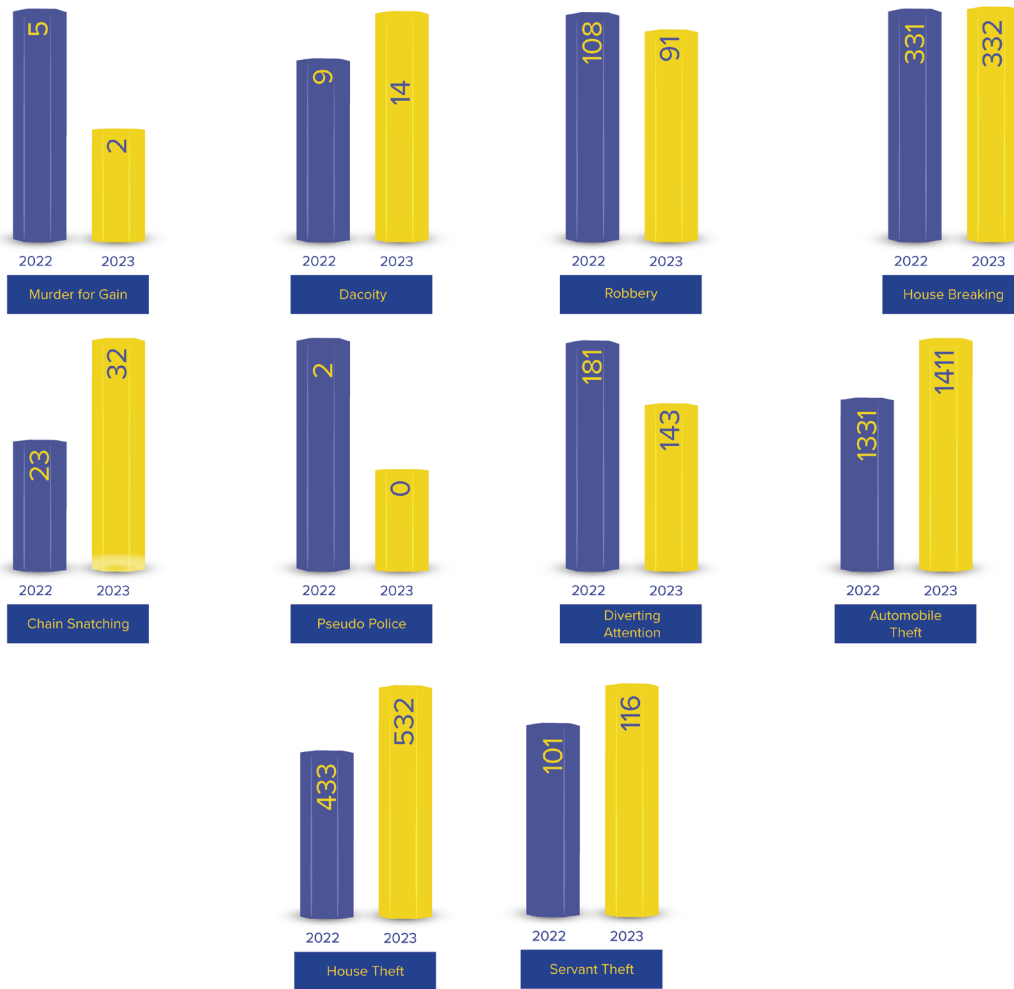

Hyderabad Traffic Police is taking number of initiatives to ease the traffic congestion to give smooth, safe, hassle free journey to the citizens by increasing average mobility in the city. Through strict enforcement of Law, counselling of Traffic Violators, Traffic Awareness Programs, robust Social Media outreach reduced the road accidents death and progressing to make Hyderabad City as **“ACCIDENT FREE CITY”**.

PELICAN SIGNALS

A pelican signal is a manually-operated system which enables the pedestrians to stop the traffic and allows them to safely cross the road. 31 Pelican Signals have been installed so far along with wardens for educating and facilitating the pedestrians to cross the roads.



OPERATION ‘ROPE’ CASES



- PRIME AND FOREMOST initiative to REDUCE OF FATAL & NON – FATAL ROAD ACCIDENTS on city roads. Identification of 65 Accident prone areas, RAAG (Road Accident Analysis Group) is formed to analyze and study the causes of Road Accidents for taking up remedial measures with Co-operation of Stake holding Depts.
- **INCREASE IN AVERAGE SPEED:** According to survey conducted by UBER / OLA Taxi Operators, the average speed of vehicles was increased due to better re-engineering of junctions and stretches.
- **DRUNKEN DRIVE ENFORCEMENT:** This enforcement is continued to save lives of to keep check on the driving of vehicles by drivers under the influence of Alcohol. The Drunken Driving was reduced remarkably, and accidents caused due to inebriated driving was reduced.

- A novel concept “Clues Team at division level was introduced in the year 2015 and since then 17 Clues teams along with Clues head office have been functioning in Hyderabad City. Each division level Clues team comprises 2 to 3 Crime Scene Officers, Photographer cum Videographer along with dedicated branded Clues Vehicle and Clues office.
- These teams search Scene of Offence minutely for collection of Physical Evidence, which enable in establishing fact of act and series of events in commission of offence.
- The services of these teams are being appreciated by Investigation Officers for their round the clock availability, quick response and systematic recording, searching, handling, lifting, packing of physical evidences and reconstruction of scene to provide valuable leads for the detection of crimes.
- The highly motivated, well trained human resources along with state of art imported equipment are the strength of Hyderabad City Clues. The unique facilities for Video Spectral Comparator for Questioned Documents visualization, 3D Scanner for accurate measurements & 3D view of entire scene, bullet hole identification kits and Sample preservation kits for DNA profiling etc.
- The appropriate training sessions are conducted by Head Office Clues teams “on Crime Scene Cordoning methods for the first responders like men of patrol cars/blue colts and PS staff or safe guarding the SOC as it is known as fountain head of physical evidence, so its preservation in proper manner makes lot of impact on the detection of crime. The first responding officer should note the important locations like entry, exit and operated areas and this training make sure how to protect SOC with proper cordoning methods.
- The impact of various factors on the eye witnesses are leading to low conviction rate, therefore it has become mandatory in Hyderabad City Police to process scene of offences for (corroborative/ circumstantial/ Material Objects) Physical Evidences, those enable to demonstrate the jury about fact of act and cause improvement in rate of conviction.
- The Clues team’s Crime Scene Officer’s skill set is aiding in retrieval and collection of digital evidence even from virtual scene of offences which are occurring in ‘Cyber Space’ a one of the future challenges in Crime investigation. Hyderabad City Police has acquired expertise on adequate Cyber Forensic Tools which are procured under “Hyderabad-Safe City Project” to deal with Cyber crimes.
- Hyderabad City Clues Head Office have been catering its services for screening of Drug samples of NDPS are being submitted by Investigation Officers of Tri Commissionerates including “HNEW”.

In the course of a comprehensive reorganization of the Hyderabad City Police, a dedicated and vital wing was established as per Government Order No. 32, issued by the Home (Legal) Department on the 30th of April 2023. This newly formed wing comprises (07) Women Police Stations, strategically positioned across various Zones, including East, West, North, South, South East, South West, and Central. Operating under the direct supervision of the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Women Safety Wing, this unit is closely coordinated with the Joint Commissioner of Police, Crimes & Special Investigation Team (SIT).

It is important to note that the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU) and the Juvenile Bureau (JB) Team are integral components of this overarching framework. Commencing its operations on the 2nd of June 2023.

BHAROSA

- Bharosa serves as a one-stop centre for victims of violence against Women and Children, including Child sexual abuse and rape. The provision of necessary services such as medical, legal, psychological therapy, child psychiatry, victim assistance, police prosecution, and judicial support under one roof is crucial in preventing victims from experiencing trauma and in the pursuit of justice.
- Bharosa has dealt with 432 POCSO cases, 119 Rape Cases and other supportive cases are 120.
- Bharosa has given Schools and Colleges admissions to 52 victims of POCSO & Rape Cases awareness programs in 97 Schools and 95 Community centers.
- Victims produced before Child Welfare Committee 217 victims were Victim Assistance Fund @ 10000/- per victim - total 91, Increase of conviction rate from 13% in 2016 to 58% 2023.

The Hyderabad City Armed Reserve Police was originally called as “AFGHAN CITY POLICE”. It was established in the year 1932 and stationed at Petlaburj Police lines, Hyderabad. In the year 1957, its name was renamed to “**CITY ARMED RESERVE**”.

- This unit works directly under the supervision of the Commissioner of Police and is headed by an officer of the rank of Addl. CP/ Jt. CP, who will be assisted by officers of the rank of DCP/ Addl. DCsP / ACsP / RIs.
- Functionally the CAR Police consists of General, Special operations, Security and Logistics groups.
- It is the Armed force reserve of the Hyderabad City Police.
- Sanctioned strength of this unit is 5402 while the actual strength is 3933.
- Providing Force to Guards & Escorts to Union / State Protectees , IAS Officers, IPS Officers, Government Establishments, Courts, Hospitals, Consulate General Offices/ Residences, UPSC Confidential Meetings and all types of Exam papers.
- Deploying Platoons (Men & Women) daily to zones for various Law & Order bando bust duties.
- As per requirements of Central Prisons Hyderabad & Cherlapally force (Men & Women) deployed for Prisoner Escorts for Courts & Hospitals in twin cities and districts.
- Providing men force for remittance Escorts to other Banks in Hyderabad City. Specialized (9) Teams (TANGO-3, EAGLE-3 & FALCON-2) well trained at Octopus Training Centre are working (24x7) under the supervision of Jt. CP CAR Hqrs/Addl. CP (L&O) Hyderabad for emergency L&O bandobust duties.
- Maintenance and Deployment of the Mounted Police and Interceptor Teams (20)
- Conducting Regular Training / Courses to Men & Women officers at CAR Hqrs, Parade Grounds.
- Providing force for short visits of VIPs & VVIPs to Hyderabad like the Hon'ble President of India, Vice President of India, Central Union Ministers, State Ministers, Chief Justice of India, Judges, and Protocol Members.
- All the Armed Reserve Police personnel of the City played an active role during unprecedented situations like Riots, Dharna, Political Meetings, Major bando bust duties, and the festivals like Ganesh, Bonalu, Ramzan, Sadar and observation of Matam during Muharram, rescue operations in the event of natural calamities and other disasters, etc.
- Organized Blood donation camp in view of Police Commemoration day in which 76 CAR Police Personnel have donated blood.
- Refreshment training courses conducted from time to time for Men and Women Police Personnel.
- In view of General Elections to the Telangana State Legislative Assembly 2023 is held on 30.11.2023 and the Counting of Votes is held on 03.12.2023. Therefore, the maximum force of CAR Hqrs, Hyd i.e., (Officers, Men, Women, HGOs and SPOs) are deputed before six months in advance for various types of elections duties to till the completion of election process.

MOUNTED POLICE

The Mounted Police Hyd city is working directly under the supervision of the Jt. Commissioner of Police, Hqrs, and Hyderabad.

1. "Mounted Police" was established in the year 1950 with a sanctioned strength of 40 Horses. The present strength of the Mounted Police is as of today 44 Horses including 5 CYB and 5 RCK.
2. Mounted police perform Law & Order duties in twinCities during Bonalu, Moharram, Ramzan, Bakrid, Ganesh Festivals and Assembly sessions, Agitations, Friday Prayer Bandobust in old city South Zone and Cricket Matches Bandobust
3. Mounted Police performing Lake patrolling duties and have saved lives who were about to commit suicide at Tank bund.
4. Mounted police performing Ceremonial parades (RepublicDay, State Formation Day and Independence Day).



SAR CPL, AMBERPET

The SAR CPL was established on 27-01-1940 by the Nizam Government at Amberpet and named as Nizam District Police. This unit was inaugurated by General H.H. Walashan Azam Jah Bahadur, Prince of Berar. This is one of the oldest armed unit in the state

- Home Guard Officers are the major component in Hyderabad City with the occupation of 40% strength Hyderabad City Police in assisting the L&O, Traffic, Bandobust duties etc.
- During the major festivals B.B duties like, Ganesh, Bakrid, Ramzan, Dussehra etc, the Hyderabad City Home Guards have done good work in peaceful completion of all bandobust duties.
- During this year due to heavy rains, home guard officers worked round the clock and performed duty at water logging places to clear the traffic.
- Home Guard officers who are working at Lake Police Station saved (67) human lives at Tank Bund those who attempt to commit suicide by jumping in the waters.
- As a matter of Streamline, a total of (286) long standing HG officers in Law & Order zones and Traffic wing are replaced for better performance of the work.
- As per Superior Officers instructions, allocate the existing available strength of Home Guards (L&O) among the newly created and existing Zones/Units as per the reorganization and the same was carried out by this office.
- A total of (188) General Home Guards are selected to work in Traffic Wing as per traffic criteria and approved by Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad. Out of 188, 50 HGs as per Traffic Seniority list were pass ported to traffic wing on 01st March 2023.
- This office has motivated the Home Guards officer to apply for TS Police Constable selection. However, a few Home Guard Officers have passed the final examination which was conducted by TSLPRB in the recent past notification.

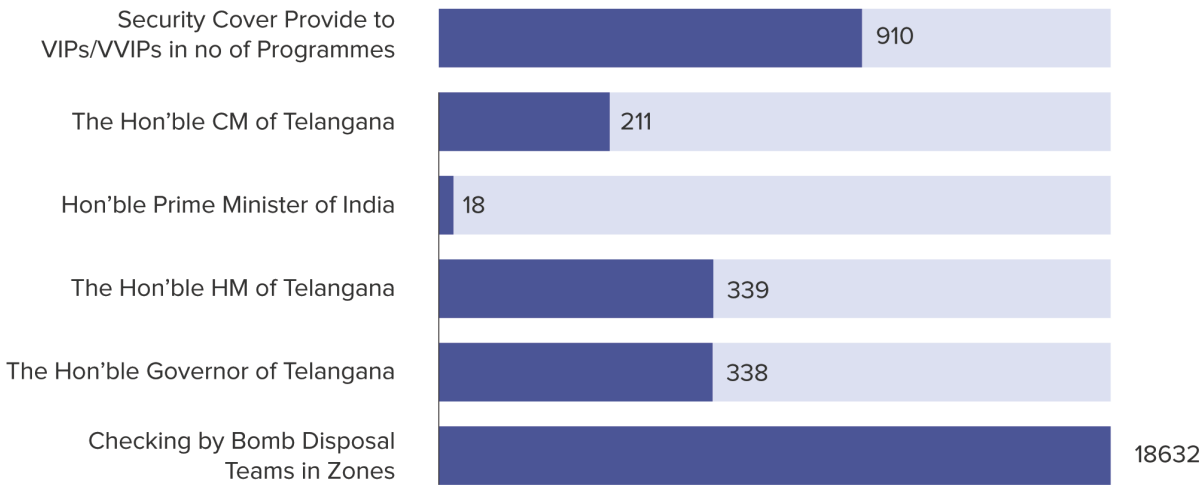

The main aim of Commissioner's Task force is to curb the organized crime and crimes & controlling and apprehending the following offenders:

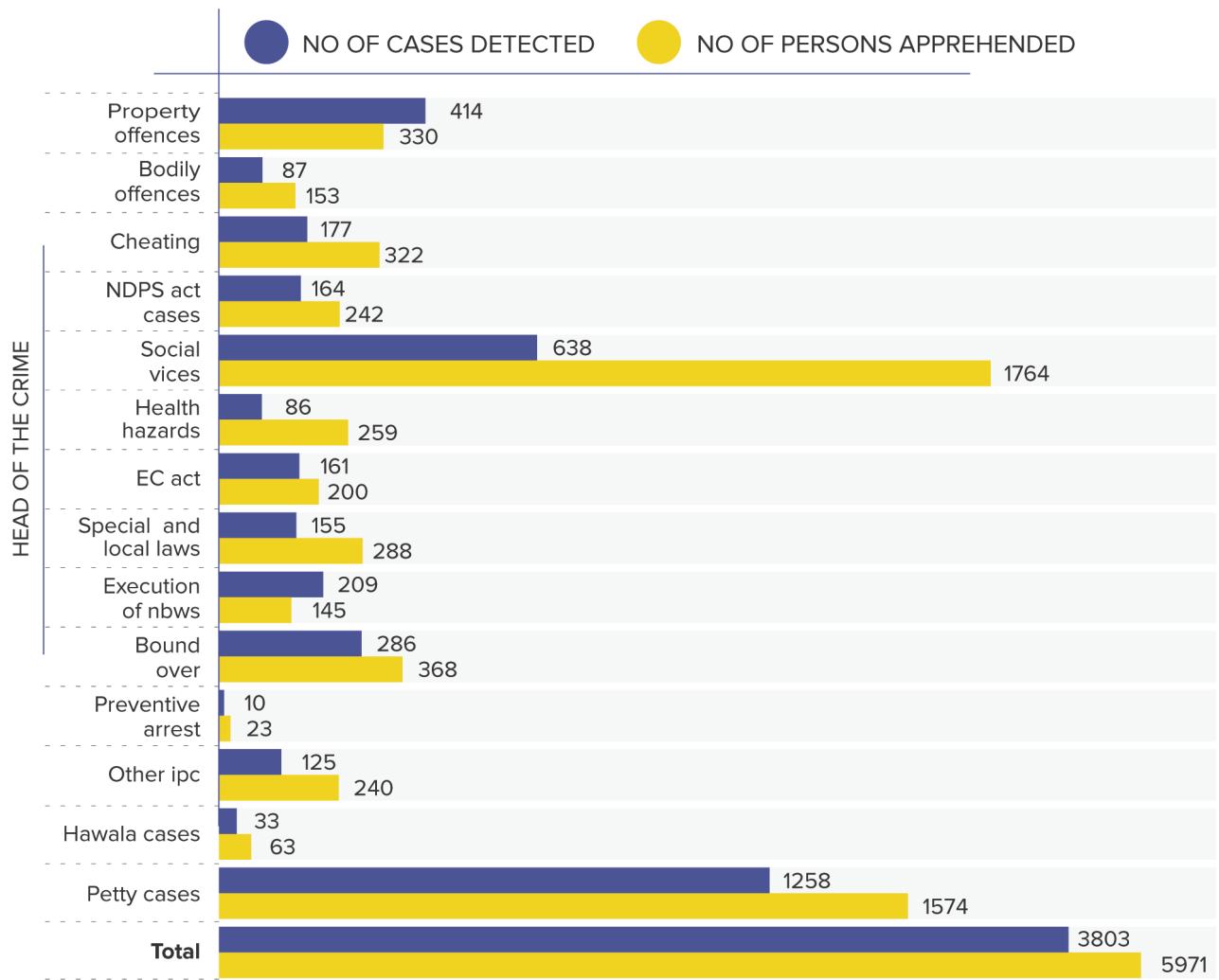
- Organized Crime and Criminal Gangs

CEIR is the citizen centric portal of Department of Telecommunications for tracing the lost/stolen mobile devices. This also facilitates for blocking of lost/stolen mobile devices in network of all telecom operators so that lost/stolen devices can not be used in India. If anyone tries to use the blocked mobile phone, its traceability is generated. Once mobile phone is found it may be unblocked on the portal for its normal use by the citizens.

These aerial assets have been instrumental in locating and monitoring suspects, and thermal imaging technology has been harnessed for identifying individuals in challenging situations. Additionally, Drones in Situations of Disasters or Calamities Authorities, especially the police, must respond to significant accidents, industrial explosions, collapsed buildings, floods, and other natural disasters. They manage, control, and fight these crises together as HCP deployed drones at Deccan mall fire accident: drones have played a pivotal role in responding to fire accidents, underlining their versatility in safeguarding the community and preventing crises.

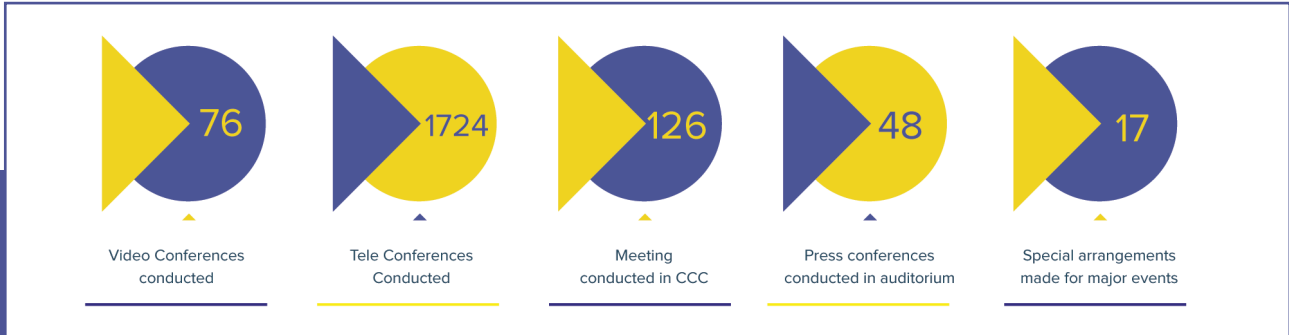
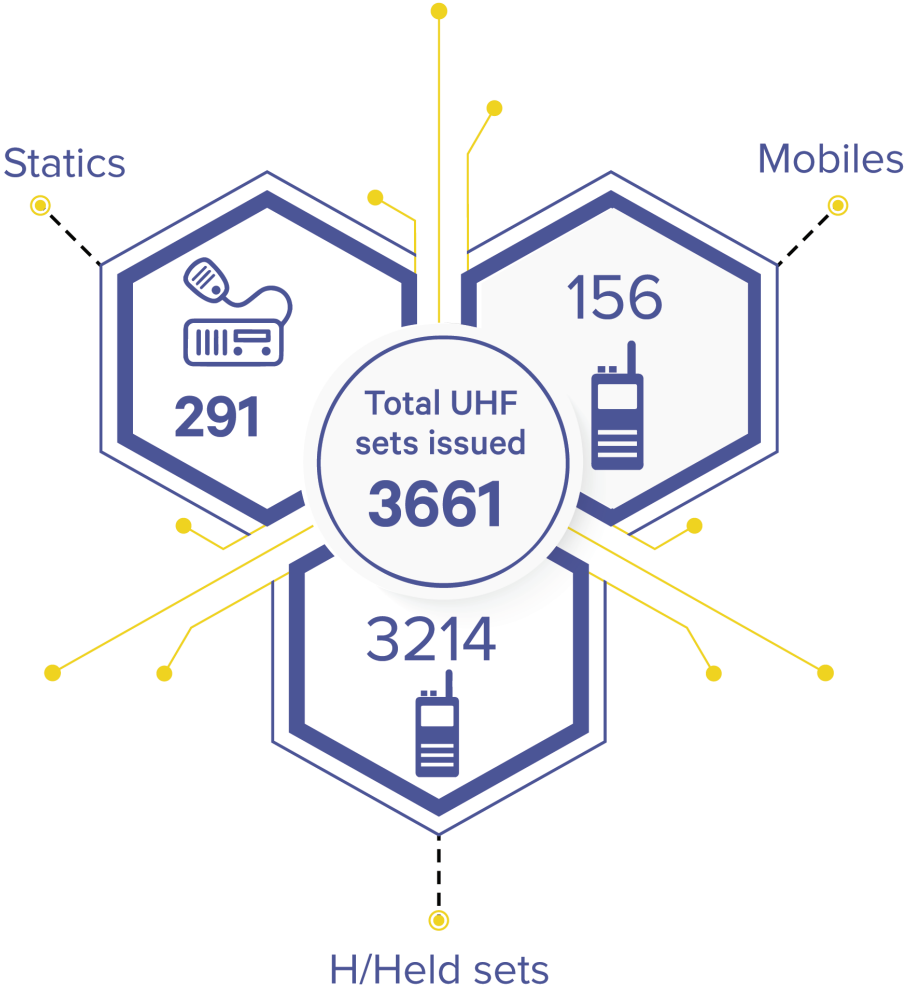

PELICAN SIGNALS INSTALLATION

30 new pelican signals were activated across the city. All these signals will be operated by trained traffic volunteer, which is first time in India, to ensure the pedestrians crosses the roads safely.

- The pelican traffic signals were launched by Hyderabad city Police in association with safe city project.
- Many road crossing systems like a foot over bridges went into disuse for various reasons as many of them lack awareness and disregard to road rules. Pelican signals benefit both the pedestrians and motorists with the former crossing the road stretch after cautioning the motorists and the later slowing down vehicles at right time.
- All these signals will be manually operated by the volunteers and will give a window of 15-20 seconds for one to cross the road safely by turning the vehicular signal red in both directions.
- An increased visibility of cross walks to drivers, and regulated and safe flow of traffic are the key benefits of this engineering measure.

5 WOMEN SHO'S IN THE CITY

First time in history of Hyderabad City Police appointed Five Women SHO's. First of its kind in the 174-year history of Hyderabad city police, five women officers were appointed as Station House Officers (SHO) of law-and-order police stations by the Telangana police, demonstrating the fact that women can deliver equally well like their male counterparts.

RESTORATION OF OLD POLICE COMMISSIONER OFFICE (PURANI HAVELI)

Hyderabad City Police & Meil Foundation Stone Laying Ceremony of a Creche exclusively for kids of Hyderabad Police

In a bid to enhance the representation and experiences of women in policing, performed Bhoomi Pooja and laid foundation stone for a new building for the proposed Creche for the kids of women police officers of City police at CAR-Hqrs, to be constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 4.5 crore funded by MEIL Foundation as part of their CSR project.

The creche will be beneficial for women officers who often have to remain in the field as part of their duties for various bandobusts 24/7. They can bring their children to work with them and have they cared for while they are on duty. This will help to reduce stress and logistical challenges for working mothers, improve productivity and promote gender equality in the workplace.

The G+1 building, can accommodate 100 children aged between 0-5 years and will be equipped with a separate kitchen to ensure that the children receive healthy and nutritious meals. The facility will be staffed by trained professionals who will provide personalized care and attention to the children. Indoor & outdoor play area, cradles & feeding rooms, medical rooms, dormitory for pregnant women with storage facility, CCTV monitoring were few key attributes of the facility.

REORGANISATION OF HYDERABAD CITY POLICE

Hyderabad Police reorganised after 35 years. The last time the city police reorganised was in 1987, when the population was about 25 lakh. During the period from 2011 to 2021, Hyderabad's population rose nearly 18 percent to around 80 lakhs.

It was on April 30 that the Home department issued orders for the reorganisation, which is a major exercise after 1987, followed by a partial reorganisation in 2002. Even after the State bifurcation, and later creation of the new districts too, the City Police's organisation remained same.

According to the new Hyderabad City Police map now, the jurisdiction will include

- **7 zones (South East and South West being the addition),**
- **28 divisions**
- **71 police stations.**
- **The Traffic Wing is reorganised into 31 police stations.**
- **The women safety wing also has seven women police stations, located one in each zone, in addition to the SHE teams and the Bharosa centres.**

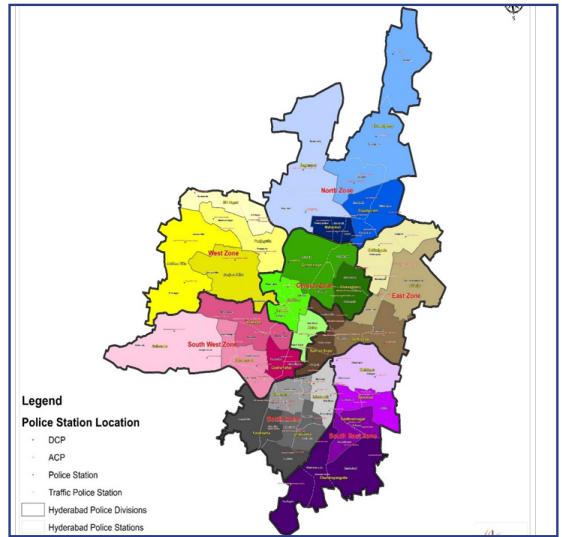

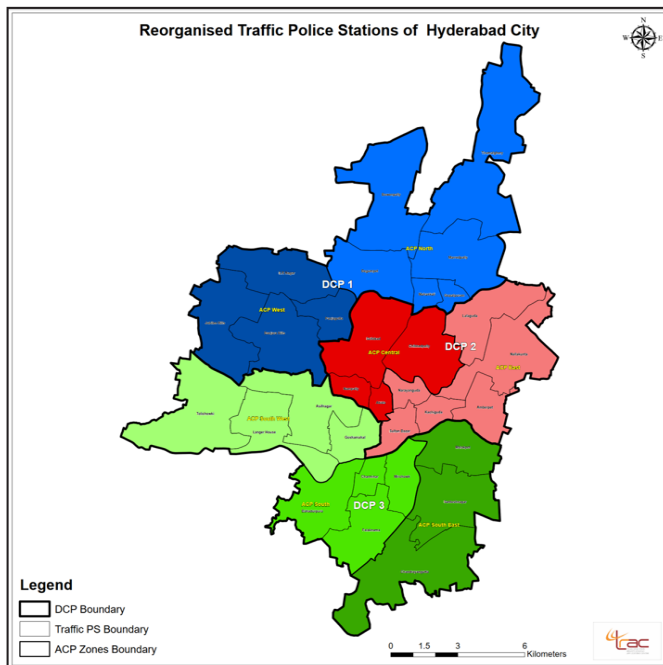
Old Map of Hyderabad City Police
